Resurrection University signed and submitted the Funding Certification and Agreement with the U.S. Department of Education on May 6,2020. (Resubmission Not Required) The University agrees to use these funds to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.

2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Student.

As of January 14, 2021, Resurrection University will receive \$530,635.00 from the CRRSAA Act Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II).

3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA Act as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the 30-day Report and every 45 days thereafter).

As of April 1, 2021, Resurrection University has disbursed \$198,000.00 HEERF II Grant. (The emergency grant review will continue until all funds are exhausted)

4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and

thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under the CRRSAA Act.

As of April 1, 2021, 1312 Resurrection University students are eligible for the HEERF II Grant.

5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA Act.

As of April 1, 2021, 38 Resurrection University students have been a recipient of the HEERF II Grant.

6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive the CRRSAA Act.

On February 16, 2021, an email was sent to all spring 2021 continuing and graduated students of the ResU CRRSAA: Covid-19 Hardship Assistance Application (HEERF II Grant). Students were directed to the Office of the Financial Aid that provided information and a link to an application form for on-campus undergraduate students. Students may complete the application to document their COVID-19 related expenses. The Office of Student Financial Aid reviews and approves applications. Students who apply and were approved for an emergency grant were sent a paper check to their address on file. Students may provide written statement to apply funds towards educational balance.

7. Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

The following guidance was sent with the checks to grant recipients:

In accordance with the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CRRSAA) Act, the enclosed emergency cash grant is being provided to you through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF II). These funds are intended for, and are to be utilized for, expenses you have experienced related to the disruption of campus operations due to

coronavirus (including eligible expenses under your cost of attendance such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care).

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR HEERF II GRANT


- Must be a U.S. Citizen and completed a 2020-2021 or 2021-2022 FAFSA Application

- Students may use the grants toward any component of their cost of attendance emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as:
 - tuition
 - food
 - housing
 - health care (including mental)
 - child care
